## TERROIR



Le Grand Enclos de Las Cases renferme un terroir d'une très grande complexité. Issu majoritairement de graves du Quaternaire sur sous-sol gravo-sableux et gravo-argileux, on rencontre également des argiles plus ou moins profondes et compactes, parfois même affleurantes. La proximité de la Gironde est responsable de cette grande diversité de sols, créée au fil des périodes géologiques par superpositions successives. De plus, le fleuve génère un microclimat bien spécifique qui permet une maturité très précoce des raisins et protège le vignoble du gel. Ce camaïeu de combinaisons géologiques influe sur le développement de la vigne et sur la constitution des raisins. Ce terroir incomparable offre au grand vin sa personnalité unique.

## MILLÉSIME 2013

Le millésime 2013 fut marqué par un printemps frais et humide à l'origine d'un début de cycle végétatif très lent et d'une floraison exceptionnellement tardive. La véraison et le début de maturation bénéficièrent ensuite de conditions favorables avec un mois de juillet parmi les plus chauds de la décennie et un début août sec et ensoleillé. Malgré le retour des pluies à partir de mi-septembre et grâce à la bonne gestion du vignoble (anticipation des effeuillages et échardages, enherbements ciblés), l'état sanitaire du raisin resta satisfaisant jusqu'au dernier jour de récolte.

I appreciate Las Cases 2013's herbal expression very much; it smartly transforms the Cabernet Sauvignon's minty fragrance into a sense of brick tea. With hints of cranberry and raspberry aromas after swirling the glass, this wine tastes like a delicate fruity flower tea. The entry of the palate is airy and smooth, with graceful lines until the end. (') Thanks to the rigorous selection during the harvest, we luckily found outstanding balance in this vintage. (September 2021)

**DECANTER / JANE ANSON**

Needs more air and time in the glass than the Clos de Marquis 2013 that was tasted alongside, reflecting the greater density of fruit that you find in the main estate even in a challenging year like 2013. As it opens, the aromatics major on raspberry and redcurrant as opposed to black fruit dominated vintages such as 2016 (or indeed the 2002 also tasted here). Be patient, because there is a ton of St Julien balance and sensibility on display, with subtle complexity and layers of earth, liquorice, cedar and incense. Subtle and fragrant, an atypical Las Cases but one that offers great pleasure for drinking, with precision and salivating freshness on the finish. (...). (August 2020)

Elegant is used in a variety of ways with tasting notes in either a complimentary sense, or in a pejorative manner. With 2013 Léoville Las Cases, it's a positive trait as Léoville Las Cases is not usually a wine that can be enjoyed before its 10th birthday. With the 2013, the fruits are ripe, present, elegant and even soft, as are the tannins. The wine is fresh, clean and correct. If you're looking for an LLC to enjoy in its youth, while waiting for the more powerful, tannic years to come around, this is the vintage. (May 2016)

**JAMES SUCKLING**

Extremely fine and complex for the vintage with blueberry, black currant and mineral aromas and flavors. Racy and refined backbone of tannins. Long and subtle. Drink in 2019. (February 2016)

**WINE SPECTATOR / JAMES MOLESWORTH**

This has a rounded feel at first, with plum, blackberry and raspberry coulis



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flavors carried by supple tannins. Slowly and surely, a brooding charcoal note emerges through the finish, adding grip while a lingering iron detail lengthens the spine. This really stretches out in the glass, maintaining superior focus. Best from 2018 to 2028. (March 2016)

**WINE ENTHUSIAST / ROGER VOSS**

This impressively powerful wine has dense tannins and concentration. With 74% Cabernet Sauvignon, it is firm, packed with black-currant fruits with intense, perfumed acidity. Cabernet Franc adds spice to the wine. The wood aging is still showing and the wine will need several years before enjoying. Drink from 2025. (January 2016)

Complex, intense red berry fruit, fresh currants, present tannins, fine chocolaty touch, good extract sweetness in the finish, mineral and promising, clearly one of the top wines of the vintage. 


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
